The National Museum of Natural History, New Delhi and its Regional Museums organised the following educational programmes, in addition to its normal activities, during the month of January, 2011.

1. N.M.N.H., NEW DELHI

Braille Day (4th January, 2011)

NMNH makes effort to involve the section of our society that includes specially challenged children who have immense capacity to understand and engulf the knowledge imparted to them. Variety of programmes and activities are conducted by the museum involving these children to achieve its mission of conservation of nature.

To commemorate <u>Louise Braille Day</u>, a special programme for visually challenged children was conducted on 18th & 20th January 2011. An "Essay Writing Competition in Braille" was organized on 18th January 2011 in two categories – Junior Group: class V to VII and Senior Group: class VIII to X. Total number of participation was 53 from 07 schools for visually challenged children in Delhi. The external judges were deputed by NMNH to evaluate the copies. First, Second, Third and Five Encouragement Prizes in each category will be given.

Senior Gp.- . To ensure a wealhy and worthy future Always live in harmony with the nature

"Declamation Contest" was organized on 20th January, 2011 for visually challenged children from classes VIII to XI. 22 students from 08 Schools for visually challenged children in Delhi participated in the programme. First, Second, Third and Five Encouragement Prizes will be given to the winners.

School Visits:

7878 students from schools in Delhi & NCR visited NMNH galleries. Educational Staff interacted with the students in the galleries. Museum publications were provided to the accompanied teachers. The schools included MCD primary schools, Government/Govt. Aided schools, Public schools and NGO groups.

Family Groups / General Visitors:

Around 2321 general visitors visited the museum. Their query was satisfied and information on exhibits displayed in the gallery was provided. Publication material was also distributed to them.

All India Conference on "Museums, Accessibility and Differently abled visitors"

The National Museum of natural History (NMNH), New Delhi through Regional Museum of Natural History (RMNH), Bhubaneswar and Museums Association of India (MAI) organized a three (03) days All India Museums Conference from 15th to 17th January 2011 on the theme "Museums, Accessibility and Differently abled visitors".
